### Forbes Solicitors looks at e-safety.



Following a session delivered by Mark & Karen at North Lancs Training Group; Forbes Solicitors shared this learning with their BTec Apprentices. This session was part of the monthly Apprenticeship workshop days Forbes deliver to their Apprentices, which helps

with team building and supports the Apprentices in getting to know one another from across the firm, given Forbes has over 320 staff and nine offices.

The training covered the key aspects of e-safety such as looking at common scams, phishing attempts and privacy settings when using social media. Our Apprentices found examples of the dangers of people using social media and online communications to groom and harm others as well as activities such as catfishing and online bullying to be particularly interesting and useful. The session

certainly raised their awareness of the risks of using social media as well as considering how to create a positive and professional digital footprint. Following the course one of the delegates commented that it had brought the issue in to the forefront of their mind and highlighted the need to regularly check privacy settings.

Forbes would like to thank Lancashire Work Based Learning Forum for arranging and NLTG for delivering the training and sharing the resources to help increase awareness of online safety. Forbes said they are aiming to spread the word to future Apprentices and this will be a standard feature of the Apprenticeship programme going forward.



### Lancashire County Council support their Apprentices up to a Level 7 Qualification

Natalie Bradley (Apprentice Ambassador) joined Lancashire County Council after leaving school. She is now on her Level 7 CIPDA apprenticeship. Lauren has written a brief article on her success in order to promote apprenticeships.

'After leaving school, I joined Lancashire County Council as a Business Administration Apprentice in the Income Team. I believed it would open up opportunities, was a good place to work and would give me experience as well as gaining a qualification at the same time.

Since then, I have been lucky enough to work in numerous teams within the Finance Department, gaining new responsibilities, good work experience, working with great people and progressing in my career. I completed my Business Administration qualification and decided

to study AAT in my own time to help with my own progression.

I am now an Assistant Accountant in the Capital Team and deal with reporting and monitoring the finances of projects. I communicate with many people and am able to see what is happening around the Council and community. I've learnt a lot in my last 5 years at the council but still transfer and use skills I learnt as an apprentice, such as invoice raising, manipulating reports and using different systems, in my current role.

I have recently become an apprentice again, but this time at Level 7 and undertaking a CIPFA qualification. I'm hoping that this will help me learn more about the financial side of the authority and improve my knowledge at work.

I am very grateful of the experiences and opportunities I have had so far within LCC and would recommend an apprenticeship here to anyone.'
